Legislation

This time I selected some changes we will have here in Ohio regarding our driver's license and some changes that may be done for teen drivers.

First, I am sure we have all heard that effective July 2, 2018 anyone that has to renew their driver's license will still go to a BMV location as they do now, but instead of getting your new license you will leave with a temporary license. The temporary license will be valid for proof of identity and residence when voting.

Also, we will be able to request driver's licenses that meet federal regulations for travel. Travel restrictions taking effect in October 2020 will require federally compliant driver's licenses to pass through airport security. There's no extra cost for these licenses.

There will be a star in the upper right-hand corner of licenses that will designate those compliant with federal regulations. Obtaining this credential will require documents such as birth certificates or passports, copies of social security cards and utility bills showing your address.

This will also apply for getting ID cards. The new ID card will arrive about 10 days after it's issued. They say this will save money and increase security.

Now about the changes that could happen for the teen drivers if it passes. The Ohio house bill 293 will extend the temporary instruction permit phase to 12 months, up from six months, and delay issuance of the first license to age 16 ½

years of age. It also would prohibit newly licensed teen drivers from driving without parental supervision between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. during the first six months that they hold an Ohio license. Current law requires supervision after midnight.

Lawmakers set 10 p.m. as the new threshold for supervised driving as a compromise. They also included a provision to drop the current requirement that teens traveling solo after hours carry documentation that they were out for work, church or school.

Keep watch to see if this does pass.
